HIGHLIGHTS OF THE BUDGET SPEECH DATED 6^{TH} MARCH, 2020 BY HONOURABLE DEPUTY CHIEF MINISTER (FINANCE) SHRI AJIT PAWAR

PART I

Agriculture:

- Total Provision of Rs.22000 Cr., Rs.15000 Cr. in 2019-2020 and Rs.7000 Cr. in 2020-21, To waive the outstanding amount of the principle and interest upto Rs. 2 lakh to make the farmers debt free under Mahatma Jotirao Phule Karjmukti Yojna 2019. Rs.9 thousand 35 Crore transferred to the farmers' accounts.
- In respect of farmers who have outstanding amount of principle and interest of crop loan taken during the period 1.4.2015 to 31.3.2019 upto Rs. 2 lakh, the Government will pay them Rs.2 lakhs after the outstanding amount above Rs.2 lakhs is deposited in the bank.
- In respect of crop loan taken into 3 years from 2017-18 to 2019-20, Rs.50 thousand will be given as an incentive to those farmers who have taken crop loan during the year 2018-19 and made regular re-payment upto 30.6.2020. However, if the amount of crop loan and completely fully repaid crop loan is less than Rs.50000, incentive benefit will be given equivalent to the amount of loan.
- 2. Follow up will be made with Central Government for making improvements in Pradhanmantri Fasal Bima Yojna, Provision of Rs.2 thousand 33 Crore for crop insurance scheme.
- 3. Provision of Rs.10 thousand crore to complete the incomplete irrigation projects in time bound manner.
- 4. Chief Minister Water Conservation Scheme will be implemented to rejuvenate 8 thousand various schemes. Provision of Rs.450 Cr. for this purpose.
- 5. New power connections will be given for agricultural pumps in rest of Maharashtra. The scheme will be implemented with the assistance from Asian Development Bank.
- 6. New scheme, Rs.10 thousand Crore programme, 5 lakh solar pumps in next five years for supplying electricity to farmers in day time. Provision of Rs.670 crore in the year 2020-21.
- 7. Provision of Rs.3254 crore for Agriculture Department, provision of Rs.7995 crore for Co-operation Department.

Infrastructure Facilities:

- 8. Provision of Rs.3500 crore will be made to complete the Kokan-Marine Highway in 3 years.
- 9. Ring Road of 170 k.m. length will be constructed to divert the traffic entering the Pune city from outside the city, Rs.15000 crore expenditure is expected for this purpose.
- 10. Financial Restructuring of Hindu Hriday Samrat Balasaheb Thackeray Maharashtra Samruddhi Mahamarg scheme, saving in the interest amount due to provision of Rs.8500 crore for this project. Krishi Samruddhhi Kendra at 20 places on this highway will be set up.
- 11. Two new schemes for road development:
- Construction of 40000 k.m. length road under Rural Road Development Scheme.
- Provision of Rs.1000 crore for Urban Road Development Scheme.
- 12. Under Pune-Pimpri-Chinchwad Metro, new lines from Shivaji Nagar to Shewale Wadi, Maan to Pirangut, expansion of Vanaj to Ramwadi Metro upto Chandani Chowk-Vanaj-Ramvadi-Wagholi. Provision of Rs. 1 thousand 656 crore for Metro by the Government.
- 13. In-principle approval to start tourist and passenger transport from Mira-Bhyender to Dombivli on Vasai-Thane-Kalyan route under the scheme of National Water Ways.
- 14. Rs.500 crore will be given to Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation for purchasing 1600 new luxurious buses in place of old buses in its fleet. At present provision of Rs.200 crore.
- 15. Provision of Rs.200 crore for modernization of bus stations of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation.
- 16. Industrial estates of international standards will be developed by incurring Rs.4000 crore expenditure in District Satara under Bangulru-Mumbai Economic Corridor on the line of Delhi-Mumbai Economic Corridor.

Health Services:

- 17. 75 new dialysis centres will be set up in the State. Rs.87 crore will be provided to purchase new ambulances in the current year by replacing 102 numbered old ambulances. Out of this, Rs. 25 crore have been provided for.
- 18. Externally aided projects costing Rs.5 thousand crore for health services and Rs.2500 Crore for medical education.

Health Services:

- 19. Planning to start Government Medical College at Nandurbar in the year 2020-21 and medical education colleges at Satara, Alibaugh and Amravati in the year 2021-22.
- 20. Inclusion of 996 types of treatments under Mahatma Jotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojna. Number of authorized hospitals will be increased from 496 to 1000.
- 21. New policy will be prepared for palliative care.
- 22. Transformation of rural hospital at Patan, District Satara and sub district hospital at Sakoli, District Bhandara into 100 bed hospital.
- 23. Outlay of Rs.2 thousand 456 crore for Public Health Department, Rs.950 crore for Medical Education and Pharmacy Department.

Education:

- 24. Rs.500 crore will be provided for external assistance to transform minimum 4 schools in each Taluka totally 1500 schools to the next four years.
- 25. Rs11 crore to Rayat Shikshan Sanstha for its Centenary year.
- 26. Proposal to increase the grant of Taluka Sports Complex from Rs.1 crore to Rs.5 crore, of district sports complexes from Rs.8 Crore to Rs.25 Crore and of Divisional Sports Complex from Rs.24 Crore to Rs.50 Crore for development of Sports.
- 27. Sports University of International Standard will be set up at Shiv Chhattrapati Sports Complex, Mhalunge-Balewadi, Pune.
- 28. Rs.2 thousand 525 Crore for Education Department, Rs1300 crore for Higher and Technical Education Department.

Industry:

- 29. Boost to cashew processing industries in Konkan division.
- 30. Increase in subsidy by 75 paise per unit to powerloom above 27 HP.

Skill Development:

31. Training will be given in accordance with the provisions of Apprenticeship Act 1961 to 10 lakh educated unemployed youth in the age group of 21 to 28 in five years by implementing new Maharashtra Apprenticeship Skill to make available employment and self-employment opportunities to those who have passed 10th standard.

- 32. The Industrial Training Institutes in the State will be upgraded and transform in modern skill training centres. For this purpose, Rs12 thousand crore investment from private industrialists is expected. Rs.1500 crore investment from the Government.
- 33. The Reservation Act will be enacted for local people's employment.

Women Development and Safety:

- 34. Gender and Child budget to be tabled first time in the state.
- 35. An office of Women's Commission to be established at Divisional Commissioner level.
- 36. Establishment of minimum one an all women police station in each district

- 37. An outlay of Rs.200 Cr. proposed for Marathwada Water Grid.
- 38. An outlay of Rs.1230 Cr. proposed for Jal Jivan Mission.

- 58. In year 2020-21 an outlay of Rs.55 Cr. is proposed for Diamond Jubilee Ceremony of Maharashtra State.
- 59. Rs.10 Cr. grant in aid for Akhil Bhartiya Natya Sammelan.

- 73. Revised estimate for Revenue Receipt for the year 2019-20 is Rs.3,09,880 Cr. There is a shortage in revised estimates due to shortfall in the revenue received from Central Government.
